

Glory Lily

Scientific Name:

Gloriosa superba

Origin:

Africa to South-East Asia

Habit:

Creeper/Climber

Distinguishing Features:

- *Leaves glossy (5-10cm), alternately arranged with a hooked climbing tendril at the tip of the leaf.*
- *Flowers, yellow and red (7-10cm) with 5 large, elongated petals.*
- *Fruit a fleshy green capsule (4-10cm), containing multiple red seeds when mature.*

Control Methods:

- *Dig out plant and all roots.*
- *Spray with 200ml Glyphosate per 10l water with 1.5 g Metsulphuron Methyl and surfactant.*
