Kudzu

Scientific Name:

Pueraria lobata

Origin:

Asia including southern Japan and south east China

Habit:

Vigorous perennial vine that can be trailing or climbing (up to 30m long)



3-lobed leaves (Photo Meri Oakwood)

Distinguishing Features:

- Leaves three lobed, 7- 25cm long and hairy on the underside
- Flowers are purple or occasionally white and pealike with a central patch of yellow in elongated clusters
- Seed pods are bean-like and hairy

Control Methods:

- Hard to control
- Small infestations can grazed, mowed/slashed, dug out or burned
- Best control is to cut and immediately paint tuberous root crowns with 100% Glyphosate
