



# Coffs Harbour Regional Landcare Community Nursery policy

- The Community Nursery at Woolgoolga is managed by volunteers to supply plants for bush regeneration primarily to the landcare volunteer membership of Coffs Harbour Regional Landcare and in the second instance to the wider community.
- Volunteer workers are members of CHRL.
- The nursery is financially supported by Coffs Harbour Regional Landcare for materials and equipment to raise seedlings and plants and support the volunteers working there.
- Seeds are collected and supplied to the nursery by volunteers free of charge.
- As the nursery is supported through public funding, it must not unfairly compete with any private business. All stock prices must be compatible with commercially produced plants, when they are purchased for funded projects.
- When plants are made available to CHRL volunteers for CHRL regeneration sites that are *not* funded for planting, plants can be made available free of charge or on a donations basis.
- Plants can also be distributed at the discretion of the CHRL executive committee and office staff.
- Nursery volunteers have no obligation to provide plants to specific people or projects – they are working under their free will and make plants available at their discretion.
- Coffs Harbour Regional Landcare members who provide seeds to the nursery for propagation should specify if they want these seeds to be propagated and how many plants they would like to use. This will avoid over-production that may become wasteful.
